# K. Department Head Reports:

Fire Chief Tucker reported 23 incidents for the month of March. It was an average month for the department. Nothing major as fires go. There were 7 commercial alarms, 4 for both motor vehicle accidents and smoke investigations, and 2 residential alarms and various other incidents. He stated they had been able to finish the maintenance projects that had been started, and other wise just operating day to day. Mayor Holland stated if you had noticed the landscaping around the City Hall, be sure to give them a pat on the back for that. They do a great job.

Mike Beasley, Parks and Recreation Director stated that ball season was in full swing, with multiple games nightly on all fields, plus a second T ball field has been made in the outfield grass on the multi-purpose field. Light mowing and a lot of weed eating is taking place. Mowing will be picking up after this week. Been trying to do a lot of clean up, painting and replacing old signage in the park and on all the properties we take care of as well. Mayor Holland mentioned that a few months back, a meeting with the skate board population had taken place and that from that some new equipment was purchased and has now been installed. We are seeing more and more skaters down at this park.

Johnny Mercer with Public Works stated that the brush truck had experienced some engine failure and has been out of commission for the last two (2) weeks, but was back on it's normal schedule Monday. We have been patching some pot holes around town, servicing our equipment and trimming trees. Mayor Holland asked if he knew when they might start paving, and Public Workers Director Mercer responded that it might be a while, as Martin Paving had several jobs in front of us.

Billy Wood, Water Superintendent reported his department was doing the same thing involving fixing leaks and unstopping sewers. Mayor Holland asked if all the water cuts had been fixed or if they were coming back. He stated that they were done at this time.

Philip Morrissett for the Codes Department was not in attendance. Mayor Holland mentioned that a lot of people were receiving notices for grass. He has had a number of people in court because of dilapidated buildings. No one has been cited into court for grass at this time. City Court has now started meeting, so there maybe more cited into court.

Police Chief Craig Moates reported for the month of March there had been a total of 1296 calls for service. He stated there had been 603 for security check-home, business & parks, 214

investigations, 164 vehicle stops, 53 traffic control and various other service calls. Currently
we have one employee in the academy, we have hired two other candidates in the last two
weeks, and they will also be trained and then scheduled for the academy as well.
